

## **First Reconciliation Details**

Date of ceremony: **Saturday, December 10th at 9:30 am** Date of candle-making (*during class*): **Sunday, October 30th** *and* **Wednesday, November 2nd** Date of practice (*during class*): **Sunday, December 4th** *and* **Wednesday, December 7th** 

- The service will begin at **9:30 am** and is expected to last about an hour.
- ✤ The candles that the children made will be on tables at the back of the church in alphabetical order. Please stop and get your child's candle when you arrive, there will be someone there to assist you. If any of the students were absent when the classes made their candles we have made extras, so candles will be ready for them at the service with their names on them.
- Your family should sit together anywhere in the church. There will be 3 4 priests located at various locations in the church for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There will be someone at each location to usher the children to the priest and back to their seat while families remain in their pews.
- If your child is doing a reading, you will be contacted with the appropriate information. Please plan to arrive at the ceremony by 9:15 am to practice. If a reader has not arrived by 9:20 am, another child will be asked to read.
- ✤ To maintain the solemnity of the ceremony, please be aware that pictures may not be taken once the service has begun. No pictures or video cameras are allowed during the ceremony.
- ✤ The children will bring home a card which you should review with your child. It describes what the children will do as they celebrate their first Reconciliation. When you review this card, please help your child prepare what they will say to the priest. Feel free to write it down on the back of the card, so there is no concern about memorization. *Most importantly, Reconciliation is a conversation with the priest, and children should not worry about what they do or do not remember from this card.*
- Religious Ed staff and volunteers will be on hand to direct your child when it is time for them to see the priest. Please have your children remain seated in the pew until he/she is asked to come up. Once they are finished with the priest they will return to the pew to complete their penance. You are free to leave once your child finishes his/her penance. As you quietly leave the pew, please take all belongings and programs with you and be respectful of the children who are still waiting to receive the Sacrament.
- There is one scheduled ceremony for First Reconciliation. In the case that a child is ill and/or cannot attend the scheduled ceremony, the Religious Ed team will follow up and arrangements will be made **after** the scheduled ceremony for a child to receive the sacrament.
