



#### **ADULT FAITH FORMATION**

**Scripture Study Groups** - The importance of understanding scripture is fairly obvious, yet we all need to be reminded from time to time that the Bible is much more than a work of history. Catholics describe the Bible as "the word of God", an expression rich in meaning, for it is also the title often given to the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity, God the Son. As the introduction to the Ignatius Catholic Study Bible explains: "This close association between God's written word and His eternal word is intentional and has been the custom of the Church since the first generation."

In a few weeks our Parish will organize a number of small study groups to focus, as our first effort, on the Gospel of St. Matthew. While scholars have never pinned down which of the four gospels was the first to be written, Matthew's account is the one quoted most frequently in the literature of earliest Christians. The Ignatius Catholic Study Bible, which we will use, is filled not only with background history but clear and complete footnotes, explaining terms, concepts, and essential messages.

We encourage you to very seriously consider joining one of the Scripture Study Groups. There are sample copies of the study guide in the library area on the lower level of the church. Please take a moment to look at it and don't hesitate to contact a member of the Faith Formation Commission if you have questions. #### PARISH LITURGICAL COMMISSION

#### Concluding Rites: We are sent on a mission!

The dismissal in Latin, "*Ite, missa est,*" (Go forth, the Mass is ended) is the reason the Liturgy is called the Mass (from *missa*, meaning sent or dismissal): We are nourished by the Word of God, in word and sacrament, and we are reminded that we are sent to discover and proclaim God's presence in all the situations of our daily lives.

And so we come to the last Sunday in the Church's liturgical year. Next Sunday is the first Sunday in Advent and marks the inauguration of the Third Translation of the Roman Missal. Since the beginning of October, weekly bulletin inserts have provided explanations for many of the revisions. In the coming weeks and months, we will experience these changes together. To help us through, there will be pew cards available for the responses by the faithful.

The following quote from the Living with Christ introduction to the Sunday Missal offers this reflection:

"...many of the [prayers] sound very different and it may take some getting used to...Our liturgy is deeply steeped in Scripture and the new translation will make that easier to experience. Some of us will have no problem with this new translation. We'll adapt easily and wonder what all the fuss is about. Some of us will have a harder time. The responses we've made for the past 40 years have cut deep grooves in our memories, and lines like, "*And with your Spirit*" instead of "And also with you" and "*consubstantial with the Father*" instead of "one in being with the Father" may not come fluently off our tongues. We'll get lost. We'll get mixed up. It may be a while before these prayers become second nature and thus a true part of our prayer...

In the end, the quality of the liturgy is not judged by the words we speak or the songs we sing, but by how deeply we are challenged to enter into the paschal mystery, to be more fully who we are and are becoming—Christ---by living his life in the events of our own."

Here are some key words from the revised missal:

Chalice: From the Latin word "calix" meaning "cup" (see Ps 116:13; Mt 20:22; 1 Cor 10:16). The use of this term in the Liturgy points to the chalice's function as a particular kind of cup and indicates the uniqueness of what it contains. A chalice is a cup from which many people drink.

Consubstantial: The belief, articulated in the Nicene Creed about the relationship of the Father and the Son: "in the Father and with the Father, the Son is one and the same God" (CCC, no. 262).

Incarnate: The Son of God assumed human nature and became a human being by being conceived by the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary: Jesus is true God and true man. As a human being, the Son of God obtained our salvation. The use of this term in the Nicene Creed indicates that Jesus' birth has a significance beyond that of any other human birth.

Lord, God of Hosts: From the word "sabaoth", hosts are the invisible powers that work at God's command over heaven and earth.

Only Begotten Son: This title "signifies the unique and eternal relationship of Jesus Christ to God his Father: he is the only Son of the Father (Jn 1:14, 18; 3:16, 18); he is God himself (Jn 1:1)" (CCC, no. 454).

And with your spirit: An ancient response to the celebrant's

words, "The Lord be with you." This response is a closer translation of the Latin "*et cum spiritu tuo*" and is consistent with the renderings of other languages. In responding to the priest, the people

reciprocate the blessing, acknowledging our shared baptism in the Spirit and supporting the particular prophetic role of the celebrant.

Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed: This response is a scriptural link to the example of the centurion who humbly recognized Jesus' authority. The Roman Rite adapted the centurion's words but changed "my servant" to "my soul". The word "roof" refers to our own personal abode into which the Lord will enter.
